# Welcome Brother Ryan Anderson, FSC, MA Coordinator of Transition and Aftercare Services

Ocean Tides is pleased to welcome Brother Ryan Anderson, FSC, MA to Ocean Tides. Brother Ryan is a member of the Christian Brothers' Midwest Direct, originally from Minnesota and joins us as Coordinator of Transition and Aftercare Services. Brother Ryan was most recently on the faculty at De La Salle High School in Minneapolis and worked in campus ministry at Christian Brothers University in Memphis. Brother Ryan has an Master in Counseling from La Salle University, PA.

As Coordinator of our Transition and Aftercare Services Brother Ryan will begin working with young men and families during their time in residence, including checking on them from time to time during home passes, providing parent education programs and parent supports in conjunction with Ocean Tides Residential Social Workers, and assisting in preparing young men and families for reunification.

After reunification, in addition to providing a place for support service at Ocean Tides *Family Support Center* in Providence, which offers young men a place to go from time to time to talk or for recreational activities as well as a place for parent education programs and groups, he will assist parents in making sure they have the resources and supports they need, and assist with school registration, assist young men finding employment if needed, and other supports and attention as needed for successful transition and reunification.

### Touching the Hearts of Those Entrusted to Our Care..... Mentoring Program to Begin...BE A MENTOR!!

Touching the hearts of young people was the hallmark challenge of St. La Salle to the first Christian Brothers and to Lasallians today. As we look to provide the best care and support possible for our young men we believe providing mentors who work with our staff during and after placement at Ocean Tides to develop a supporting and guiding relationship will assist them in a way staff and faculty cannot and provide another support for them toward their success.



Mentors, adult role models would meet with a young man, perhaps once a month, during placement to get to know them and help them establish goals and direction for their future, and then keep in touch with them in a similar way for 6-12 months after they leave Ocean Tides residential program. Supports and guidance during those initial months back home is vital to long term success and where mentors will have an incredible impact. Ocean Tides will provide training and opportunities for mentor activities as well as work with mentors as they and their student develop common interests and support. We hope to train our first group of mentors late this fall.
