EXPERIENCE CENTERED CURRICULUMS

Six Career & Technical Experience Centered Curriculums allowing Ocean Tides students hands-on experiences in:

- Construction Technology: accredited by Local 330 of the American Laborers and Carpenter's Union and UBC Local 94 – Career Connections Program – the only small private school in Southern New England to offer this program.
- 2. Culinary Arts Exploration: cooking, baking, meal preparation, budgeting, and food service management give our students' real world Culinary Arts experience.

It entails developing certain personal and interpersonal awareness and sensitivities, understanding certain bodies of cultural knowledge, and mastering a set of skills that, taken together, underlie effective cross-cultural teaching and culturally responsive teaching and learning.

We have become a leader in Online Virtual Learning in Rhode Island...

4th Quarter Distance Learning Statistics:

- 1. 90% of our students checked in to our Principal on a daily basis.
- 2. 70% of our students worked on 80% of their schoolwork on a daily basis.
- 3. Over 95% of our students communicated weekly and some daily with our School Social Worker and our Special Educator for direct 1 on 1 service time.

- 1. Implemented a Hybrid Learning Model- appointment based learning
